Flip your mindset.

- Stop thinking about contributions as something you *should* do to gain karma.
- Start thinking about contributions as a way to increase your value (and bring karma as a bonus!)

Flip your mindset.

- Stop thinking about contributions as a marketing afterthought.
- Start thinking about contributions as a marketing tool.

Flip your mindset.

- Stop thinking about how contributions are good for karma.
- Start thinking about how contributions are good for business.

- Helps to organize new contributor sprints at Drupal events.

- Encourages and supports 4-6 hours/week for employees to contribute.
- Has a "contrib-first" policy.
- Monthly blog posts about progress.
